Dear My Beloved Aunt,

To my beloved aunt, missionary Yoon Hyun Ju. I am currently at the airport in Buffalo, on my way to Los Angeles. It's snowing even though it's April. I heard last Tuesday that you passed away in the Philippines. I was preparing my sermon when I heard the sad news, and it felt like I was hit by a ton of bricks. You were getting chemotherapy treatments, and even recently you spent time with Joseph's family in the Philippines... I even saw pictures from the

dedication ceremony and the special song...

I was sad that I couldn't attend your funeral service since it was being held on a Sunday. Thankfully I heard from John that the burial and the graveside service was scheduled for Tuesday, so I bought a ticket to LA that had me leaving from Buffalo immediately after the Sunday service. I was glad that I could at least make it. Palm Sunday service was a joint service between the Korean and Faith congregations and I let them know about your passing. After first relaying it in English, I was speaking in Korean when I was overcome with emotions. We always prayed for you and uncle during the women's QT meetings, and talked about you during the weekly young adult meetings while we made offerings to help orphans India's Kuntrakal. I think the members of my congregation held a special place in their hearts for you.

I regret not seeing you more frequently even though we were both living in the States. Do you remember when you visited Rochester in 2008? My daughter Joy was only two years then. She took an immediate liking to you but she cried every time uncle came close to her. After a while, he would walk back and forth in front of Joy and said "I'm not going near you, I'm just walking by!" which inevitably made Joy cry, after which you told him "don't do that to her – she doesn't like it." But I think his perseverance paid off – on your last day here she finally warmed up to him and held him close.

When you visited again in 2011, it seemed like Joy remembered you guys well from three years earlier. When we went to visit the Erie Canal, uncle gave her a piggyback ride and you cuddled with her. We sat in the rain and watched my son Chansoo play in a soccer game and had breakfast at Tim Horton's after dawn prayer service... I recall fondly uncle's first sermon – "Found treasure – the reason for his calling." I found out why you two became missionaries during that sermon. I remember vividly your singing the special song – your voice was beautiful and calm yet powerful... your coming to my church to worship was such a touching moment that gave me strength. I was so touched whenever you called and said "Dear Pastor Lee, I hope everything is well." Now your voice is forever etched into my memory. I saw you in LA three times. Once was during Joyce's wedding. The second time was in 2017 when I attended the UMC Korean conference. You were already getting chemotherapy treatments by then. You greeted me with Joseph and we had lunch together. Even though we didn't get to spend a lot of time together, it was a joyful occasion. Cont. Inside.

Letter from Pastor Lee Cont.

You always took care of me like a mom and encouraged me. You were so beautiful when you smiled, and it was so calming when you encouraged me with your smile. Now those smiles are stored in my memory as well.

And finally, last summer! I met you for the third and last time in LA when my wife and I were on a road trip together. For the past 25 years, I dedicated myself to serving God and leading the ministry, and I took this special trip for the next 25 years. We decided to drive across the country so that we can pick up Joy in San Diego, who went on a mission trip to Mexico. After driving for countless hours with my wife, seeing you and uncle in LA was a special moment. Even though you looked more frail than before, I realized that there was nothing like spending time with relatives that I love... Even though you weren't able to eat meat for health reasons, you declared "time for some meat" and took us to a BBQ place, and I know you did that so that you could treat me and my wife to a special meal. We caught up over wonderful conversations and melon icicles from the Korean supermarket next door and watched the sunset together.

Oh, do you recall telling me that you were planning on visiting Joyce in Manhattan in January 2019 and

you were going to stop by Rochester? You knew that pianist Cho Seong-Jin had a concert scheduled in Rochester and mentioned that you really wanted to attend and hear his playing, so I purchased tickets for you and uncle right then and there. But I was really sad that you were eventually too weak to make the trip out here from LA...

I wish that I could have consoled you better and let you know how much I loved you had I known that seeing you then was the last time that I would see you alive. You always called me twice a year to make sure that everything was okay, and when you were diagnosed with cancer, you called and asked me to pray for you... Missionary Helen Yoon! You were so brave. As a wife, as a daughter-in-law, mother to three children, and as a missionary and servant of God who loved the people of the Philippines and India. You served God so faithfully and now you are with him in Heaven. I am so happy that you were my aunt and proud to be a part of your family. I hope you are resting peacefully in heaven next to God where there are no more tears, no more pain, and no more worries. I am going to miss you so much. Missionary Yoon Hyun Ju! My "mom" in the States! My fellow servant! You loved Jesus with all your heart and you dedicated your life to spreading his message. My beloved aunt. Rest in Peace in Jesus our Lord! I love you! God bless you!


